JOSH CENTOR: Welcome to Mondays with miles.

You know, 7 universities plant in the fall and harvest in the spring. 8 That's when our students graduate, when they begin to go on to lives of their own, in the so-called real world. 9 10 And they get shocked. But it's a great time. Those black gowns 11 12 and hats in the air will never cease to be great fun for 13 me. 14 JOSH CENTOR: You know, I've had one 15 commencement, and you've been on a number of campuses and 16 attended commencements all over the place. Do they 17 differ? Is each one different on each campus? Is it 18 different from campus to campus? How does that work? 19 DR. MYLES BRAND: They are different. They 2.0 all reflect the traditions and the campus community. 21 there is something also the same. It's happy students, 22 happy parents. It's marching down the aisle to Pomp and Circumstance -- which is my second favorite song, I 23 24 should tell you. And it's great. 25 It's a renewal time; it's a commencement.

1	But it's also a beginning. That's what commencement					
2	means, to begin. And they're beginning the rest of their					
3	lives. And you get you've given the students the best					
4	you can, and it moves forward.					
5	You know, the interesting thing for me					
6	right now is that more and more on commencement,					
7	graduation, we're seeing student athletes. Student					
8	athletes are graduating at higher rates than the general					
9	student body right now. And we're seeing more and more					
10	students walk walk by in those black gowns, so we're					
11	very proud of that.					
12	JOSH CENTOR: With your academic reform					
13	initiatives, I assume we'll probably see more and more					
14	coming down the way.					
15	DR. MYLES BRAND: I certainly hope so. The					
16	more the better.					
17	JOSH CENTOR: Absolutely. Well, enjoy the					
18	nice weather. And we will see you all next week.
